Restorative justice (RJ) is a process that brings those harmed by crime, and those responsible for the harm, into communication, enabling everyone affected by a particular incident to play a part in repairing the harm and finding a positive way forward.

It can provide a means of closure and enable the victim to move on.

It provides offenders an opportunity to face the consequences of their actions and where possible make amends.

All victims of crime should now be offered RJ free, provided the circumstances warrant it.

But victims of anti-social behaviour do not have access to free RJ.

This conference will explain more how RJ works, discuss the costs and benefits of RJ and explore how to make it more accessible for everyone.
